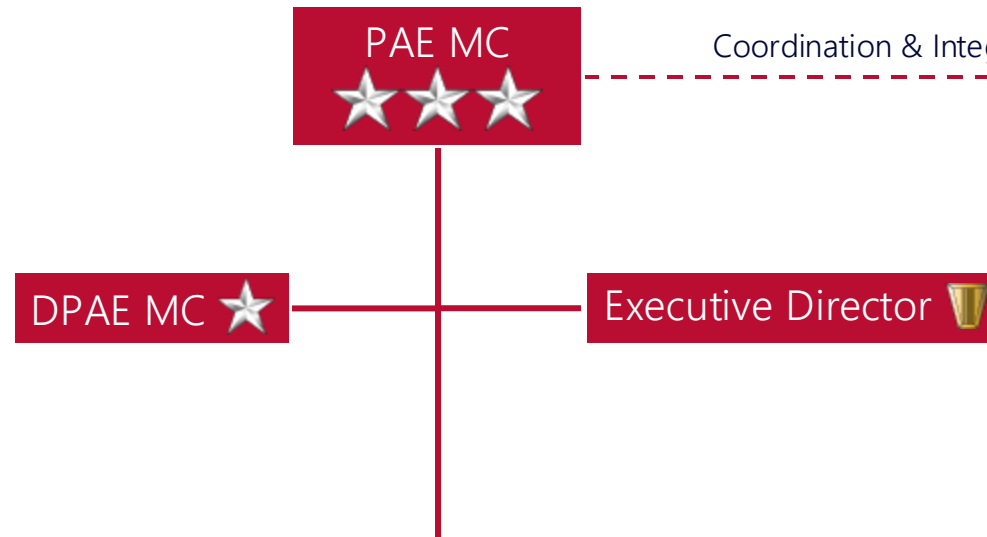

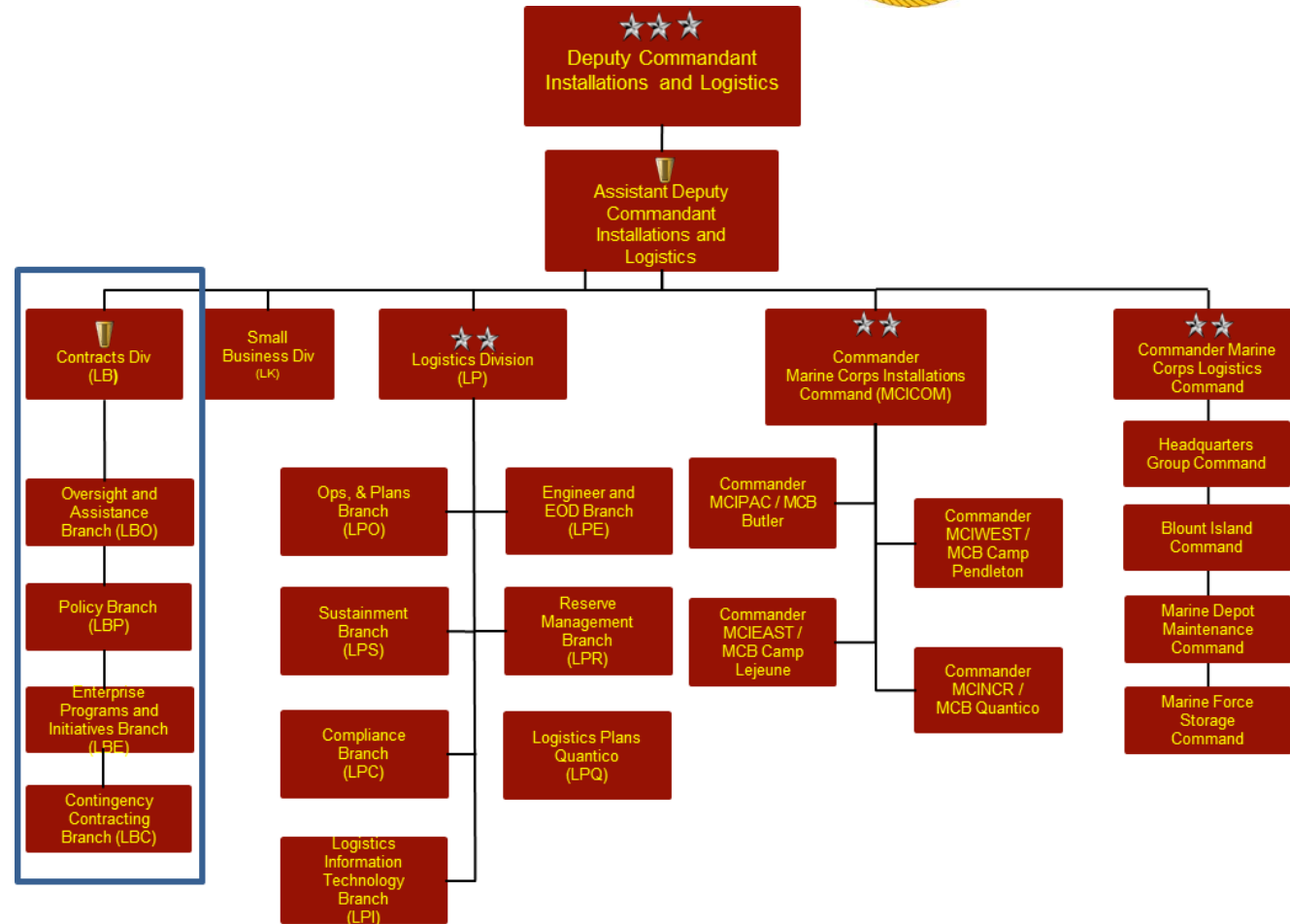


DC I&L Mission and HCA Unique Authority

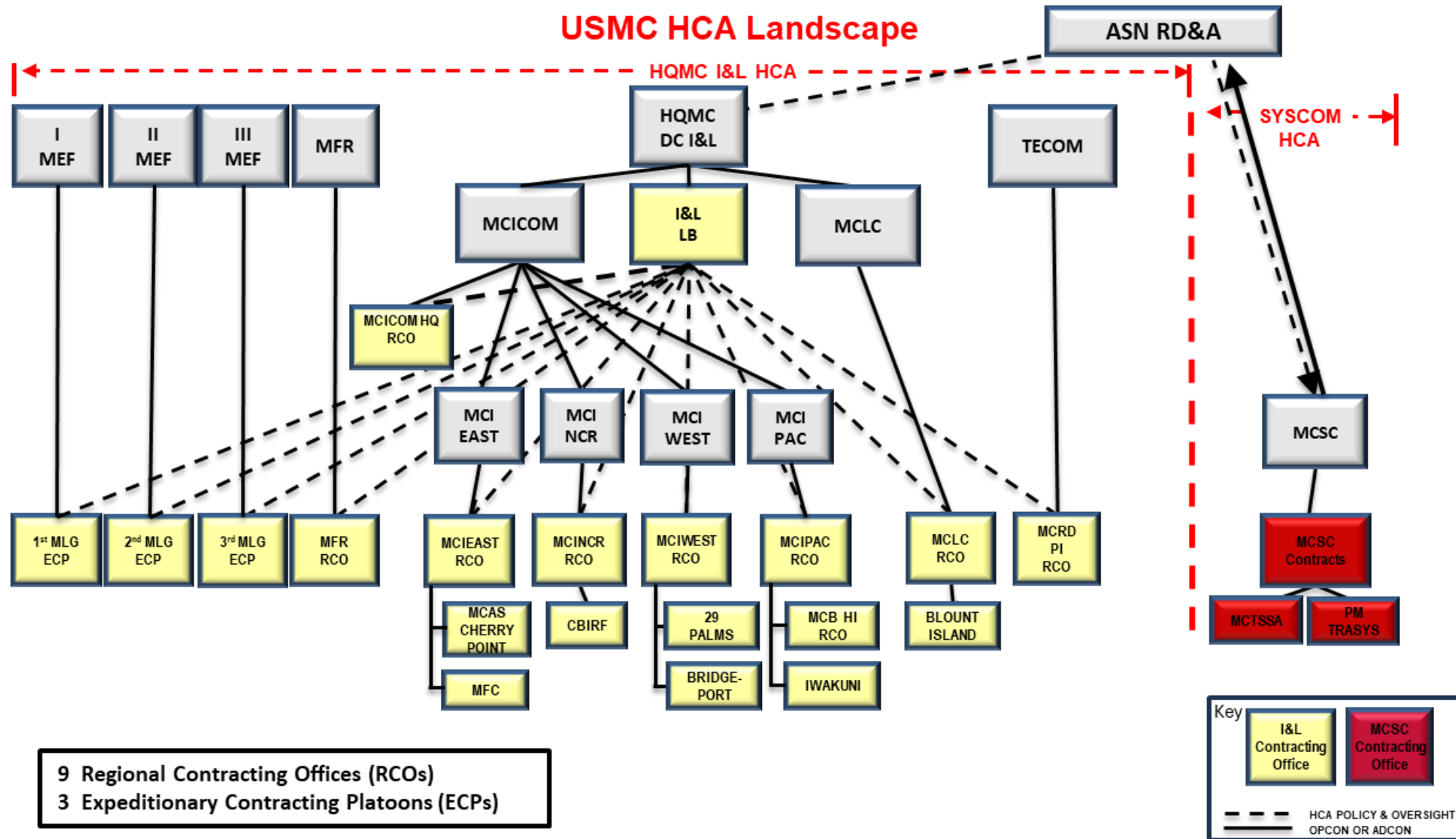
- Develop, integrate, and coordinate plans, policies, and sustainment resources to manage the total life cycle of ground equipment and facilities;

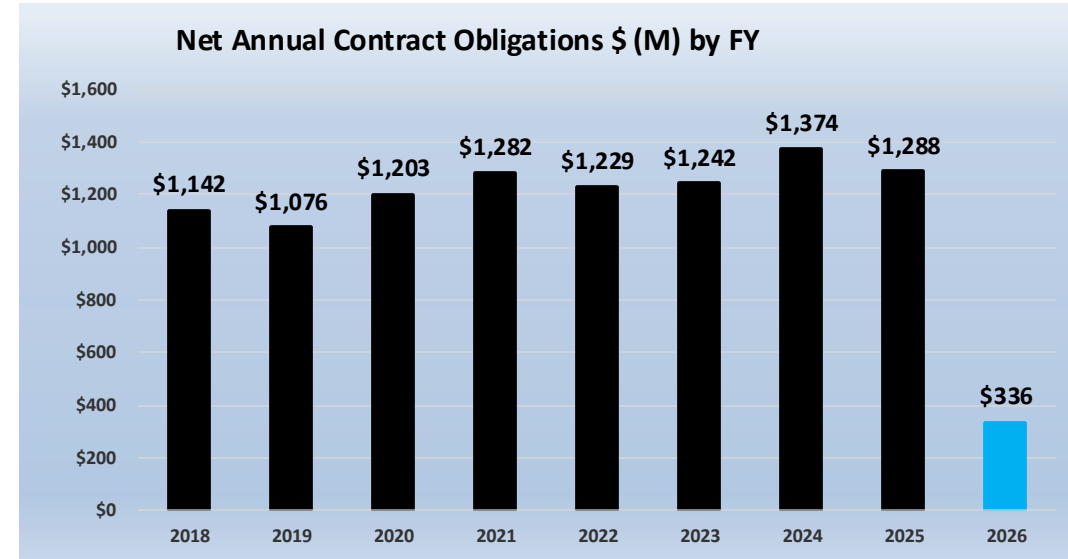
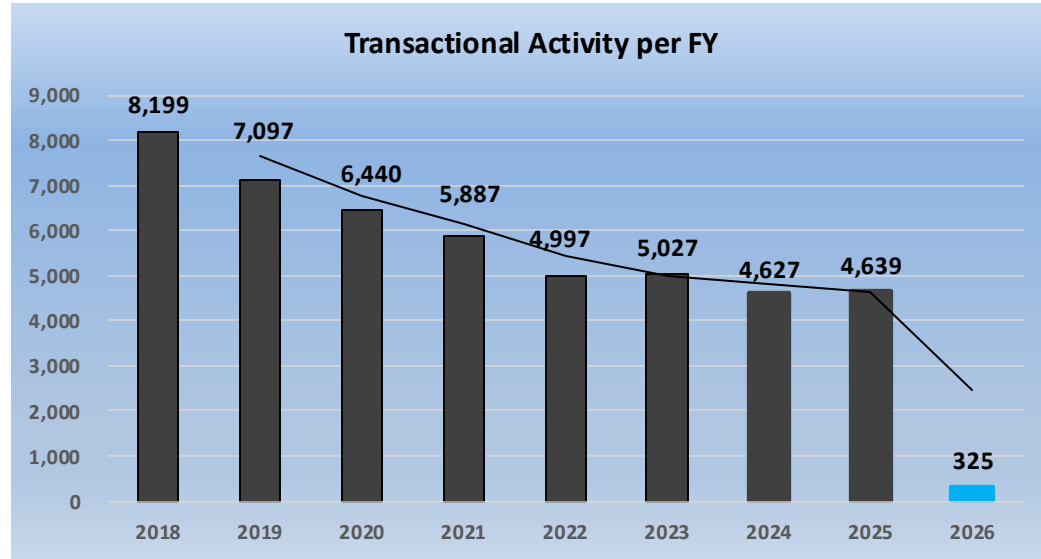

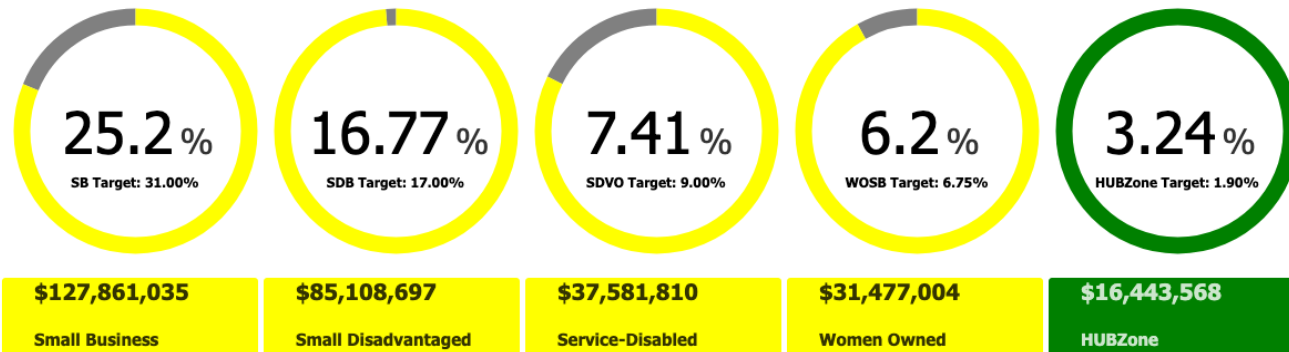
