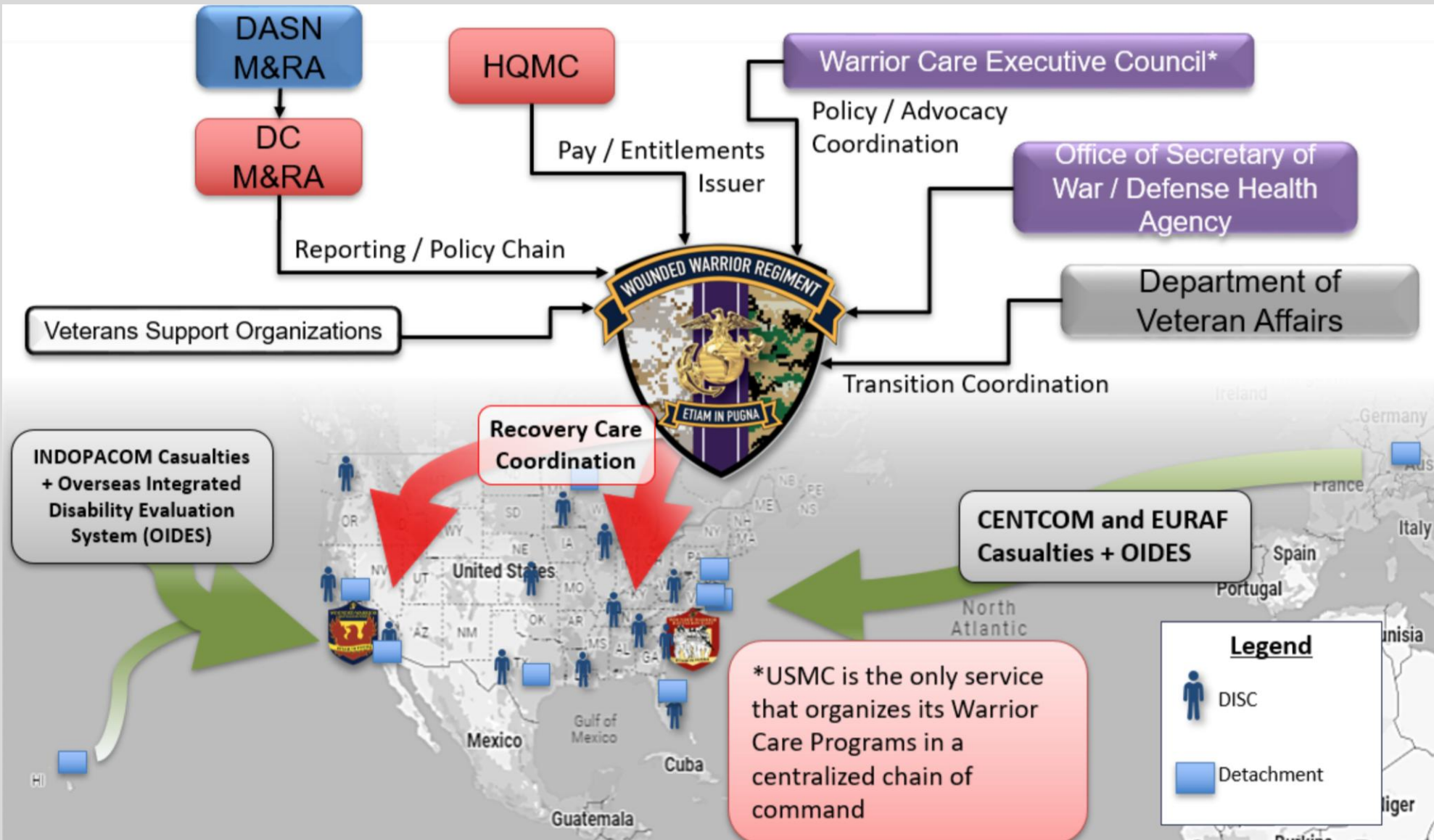

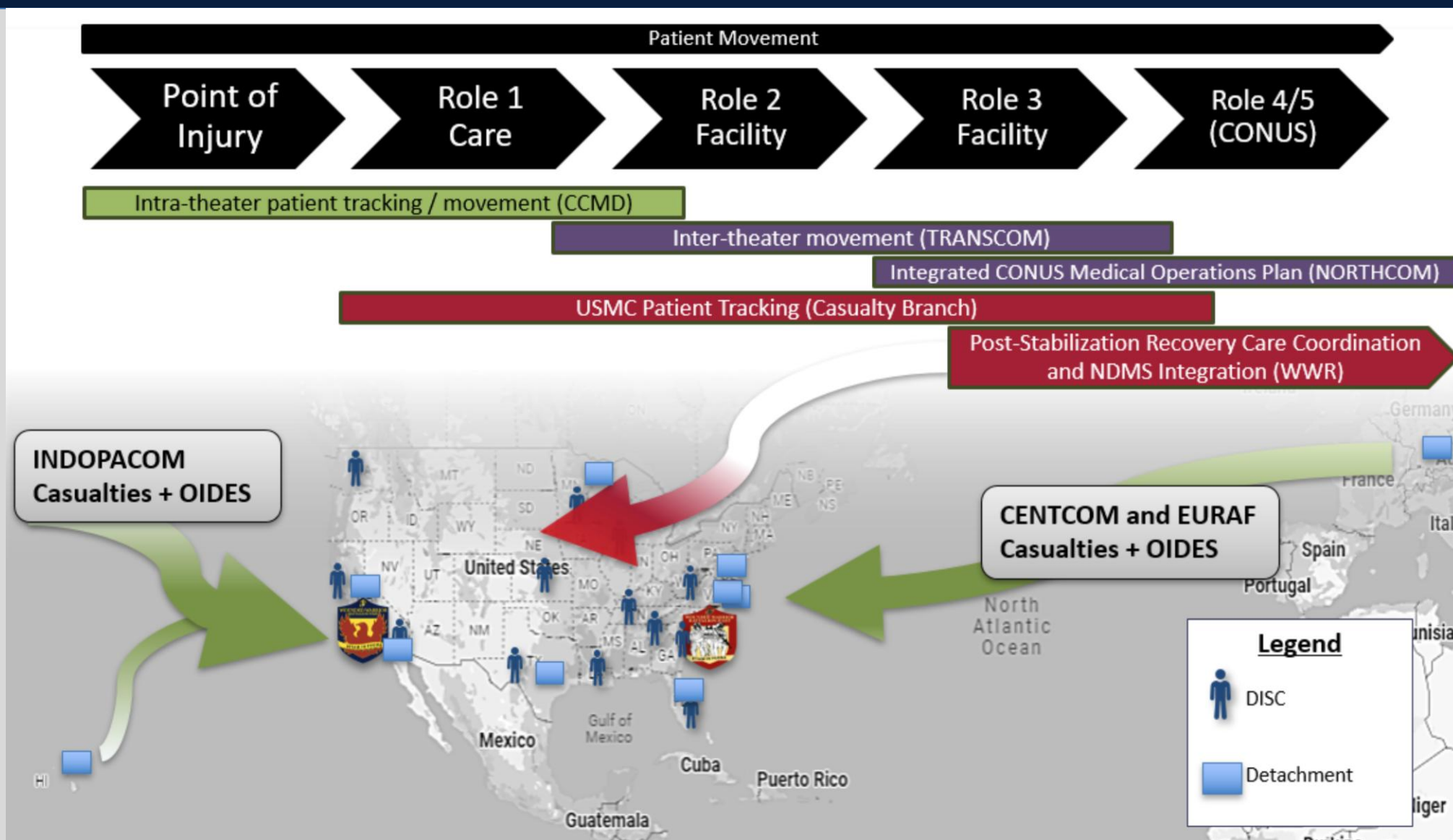


WWR "STEADY-STATE" OPERATIONS

WWR Assignment



Identify

Daily review of every PCR/SIR/CCIR generated across USMC and provide outreach to commanders

Maintain a presence at military medical facilities supporting Marines

Conduct initial needs assessment



Assess

Conduct outreach to affected Marines' unit commanders to offer support

Assign SI/VSI a WWR asset, generally a Recovery Care Coordinator (RCC)



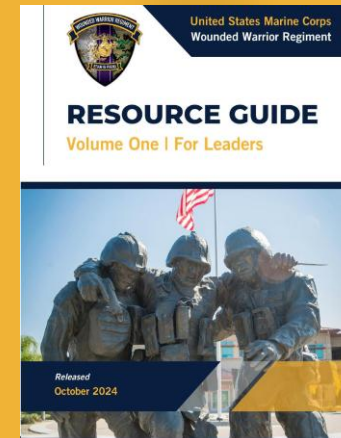
Support

Determine appropriate level of support and potentially assign WWR asset; some cases may require immediate intervention

Receive referral packets for complex care cases

Outreach and Veteran Support DISCs & FSRs

Both DISCs and FSRs are available to support veterans in crisis and are dispatched through regiment operations.



District Injured Support Coordinator (DISCs)

DISCs are mobilized Marine Reservists located throughout the country to assist RSMs and their families:

- Transition from active duty or reserves to veteran status
- Identify and solve problems related to VA support and services
- Facilitate support regarding benefits and entitlements
- Respond rapidly in cases of emergency

Field Service Representatives (FSR)

FSRs are contractor support assigned through the Wounded Warrior Operation Center (WWOC). FSRs function the same as DISCs – supporting the most complex care cases as they transition to veteran status.



Outreach and Veteran Support / WWCC

The Sergeant Merlin German Wounded Warrior Call Center (WWCC) is available 24/7 to make and receive calls and render assistance to RSMs, Marine veterans, and their families with:

- Benefits and Entitlements
- Counseling on a variety of issues
- GI Bill
- Traumatic Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance
- Employment/ Education
- Social Security Disability Insurance
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Awards (e.g., Purple Hearts)
- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Veterans Administration
- IDES outreach during each phase



To support the active duty WII Marines who remain with or have returned to their parent command, each WWBn has a contact center. Hours for both Contact Centers are Mon - Fri from 0800-1600 (local time) excluding holidays.

MCTF strengthens Marines and families across four domains – social, spiritual, mental, and physical. It improves their overall well-being and readiness by promoting skill-building that helps them perform at their best and navigate their military journey successfully.

SOCIAL FITNESS

Forming healthy positive relationships with your peers, leaders, friends, family members, and community. Includes being kind, respectful, and being able to forgive self and others.

SPIRITUAL FITNESS

Finding inner strength that comes from a higher purpose. While grit and determination are important, discovering an even greater strength by looking beyond oneself to a higher, more lasting source of meaning and purpose.

MENTAL FITNESS

Engaging in healthy thinking and behaviors builds strong intellectual and emotional habits. Included are mindset, attitudes, and practices to help manage various stressors and reach optimal performance.

PHYSICAL FITNESS

Building a well-rounded fitness program by possessing the knowledge, skills, mindset, and tools to perform well, prevent injuries, and recover.

LINES OF OPERATION

WWR's Lines of Operation (LOO) are inextricably intertwined and cannot be executed in isolation. Failure of one LOO attrites the whole of our mission and endstate.

MEDICAL LOO

Align and coordinate with the Marine's primary medical team to manage the comprehensive recovery plan, establish achievable goals, and inform the other LOOs.

SPIRIT LOO

Reignite the spark within the Marine by providing a sense of belonging, purpose, pride, and renewed sense of self-confidence.

FAMILY LOO

Encourage, nurture, and guide Marine's family through the recovery process and beyond.

MIND LOO

Provide activities to improve the Marine's self-worth, mental stability, sense of purpose, and clarity of mind.

BODY LOO

Strengthen the Marine's body through physical activity and nutrition to develop life-long health habits.
